

# **iPhone Terminology**

*All of these terms are explained in one or more videos in the course.*

<b>Term</b>	<b>Definition</b>
Lock Screen	The screen you see when you activate your phone. If your passcode/fingerprint/facial recognition is activated, you will have to sign in to go any further.
Home Screen	After signing in, it is the first screen you will see. Usually the icons for the Camera and Photos app reside here.
Dock	The strip at the bottom of your home screen that hold 4 icons.
Search	This feature allows you to search your iPhone for items using keywords. Swipe right until you see the window at the top of your screen that says "Search".
Power On/Power Off	When your iPhone goes dark and seems to be off, it probably is not. To Power Off, hold button on top rim or right side until you see a slider "Power Off". Hold down again to "Power On".
Control Center	A setting that provides access all in one place to a variety of iPhone features: camera, volume, airplane mode and many more.

Tap	A light touch on your iPhone screen opens apps.
Long Press	Holding your tap for an extra second or so constitutes a long press. This action often provides additional options in an app.
Swipe	A quick flick of your finger allows you to navigate between screens. On some iPhones, you swipe up from the bottom to get to the Home Screen.
App	A small software program that focuses on one feature such as the camera or weather.
Portrait & Landscape Mode	These terms refer to how you hold your iPhone. Portrait = vertical & Landscape = horizontal.
Passcode	The 4 or 6 numbers you enter to unlock your iPhone.
Face or Fingerprint ID	You can use Face or Fingerprint ID to unlock your phone (Depends on which iPhone).
Notifications	Alerts to new texts, emails, and much more.
	Icon for data that is stored in the cloud. When you click on it, the data/file is downloaded to your iPhone.
iCloud	Apple's iCloud stores data for you in case something happens to your phone.
